It was moved by Skalko and seconded by Tuomela that the consent agenda be approved as follows:

WHEREAS, the proposed mining and processing operation will create 360 direct jobs and over 600 indirect jobs in St, Louis County alone; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the PolyMet Mining project will require 2 million hours of labor during its construction phase; and

WHEREAS, PolyMet Mining will contribute millions of dollars to local cities, school districts and the State though net proceed taxes, occupation taxes, and sales tax; and

Mayor Skalko called the City Council meeting to order at 6:53 p.m. with the following members present: Joe Prebeg, Jr., Susan Tuomela, Tony Zupancich, Alan Stanaway, and Mayor Gary Skalko. Also present were: Craig J. Wainio, City Administrator; Jill M. Clark, Municipal Services Secretary; and Michael Downs, Director of Public Works.

The Mayor said that the purpose of the Committee of the Whole meeting was to discuss the compensation for the Fire Department Officers.

Councilor Zupancich asked what the budget amount was for the fire department wages.

Councilor Prebeg distributed a worksheet showing several facts about the fire department wages as follows:

- Fire Run Wages/Training Wages. A raise was made in 2013 for the hourly rate for all of the fire department members to be increased from \$10.00 to \$12.00 per hour, representing a 20% increase. The last wage increase prior to that was made in 2007.
- ➤ City Worker Wage Increases. Reviewed the annual wage increases of the Union Employees. He said that they received approximately a 13% increase since 2007.
- > The proposed wage increases recommended by the Public Health and Safety Board for the Fire Department Officers were approximately 60%.

Councilor Prebeg asked that the Council consider a compromise between the Personnel Committee proposal and the Public Health and Safety Board proposal.

Councilor Tuomela requested the number of hours per month that the officers actually work.

The Council asked the City Administrator to make sure that any wage increases are budgeted for and have the fire department officer's wages on the next City Council agenda.

At 7:23 p.m. it was moved by Skalko and seconded by Zupancich that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried.


