MINUTES MOUNTAIN IRON CITY COUNCIL BOARD OF APPEAL AND EQUALIZATION APRIL 20, 2017

Mayor Gary Skalko called the meeting to order at 6:00p.m. with the following Councilor members present: Joe Prebeg, Jr., Alan Stanaway, Susan Tuomela, Steve Skogman, and Mayor Gary Skalko. Also present were: Amanda Inmon, Municipal Services Secretary; Brian Grahek, Principal Appraiser for Saint Louis County; Shawn Hainey, Real Estate Appraiser for Saint Louis County; and Patrick Orent, Principal Appraiser.

The Saint Louis County officials stated that for the City of Mountain Iron overall median sales ratio was at 87.6%. Nominal increases in building values were made in the city proper, and nominal increases in building and land values were made in rural Mountain Iron to adjust the City's median sales ratio to meet the Minnesota Department of Revenue's required no less than 90% and no more than 105% sales ratio. After adjustments based on the sales ratio study, Mountain Iron's median ratio is 91.6%.

It was moved by Prebeg and seconded by Tuomela to accept the recommendation of the County Assessor to reduce the building value amount from \$46,600 to \$46,400 to the property of John Roskoski, 5732 Mineral Ave, Mountain Iron, Parcel Code 175-0010-02500. The motion carried with 4:1 with Skogman objecting.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 12-17

CALLING A HEARING ON PROPOSED ASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, by a resolution passed by the council on April 17, 2017, the City Administrator was directed to prepare a proposed assessment of the cost of Improvement Number 15-09, the improvement of Garden Drive between Arbor Lane and Fairview Lane by overlay, and

WHEREAS, the City Administrator has notified the council that such proposed assessment has been completed and filed in his/her office for public inspection,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MOUNTAIN IRON, MINNESOTA:

- 1. A hearing shall be held at 5:30 p.m. on June 5, 2017 in the Community Center located at 8586 Enterprise Drive South to pass upon such proposed assessment. All persons owning property affected by such improvement will be given an opportunity to be heard with reference to such assessment.
- 2. The City Administrator is hereby directed to cause a notice of the hearing on the proposed assessment to be published once in the official newspaper at least two weeks prior to the hearing, and he/she shall state in the notice the total cost of the improvement. He/She shall also cause mailed notice to be given to the owner of each parcel described in the assessment roll not less than two weeks prior to the hearing.
- 3. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the county auditor, pay the whole of the assessment on such property, with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City of Mountain Iron, except that no interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid within 180 days from the adoption of the assessment. An owner may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Administrator the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year.






