Mayor Skalko called the City Council meeting to order at 6:31p.m with the following Council members present: Susan Tuomela, Alan Stanaway, Joe Prebeg, Jr. and Mayor Gary Skalko. Also present were: Craig J. It was moved by Skalko and seconded by Tuomela that the consent agenda be approved as follows:

RESOLUTION NUMBER 29-16

APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION IMPROVEMENT REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2016A

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF MOUNTAIN IRON, MINNESOTA, as follows:

- 1. The City Council hereby finds and declares that it is necessary and expedient for the City to sell and issue its fully registered general obligation improvement refunding bonds in the total aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$600,000 (herein, the "Bonds"). The proceeds of the Bonds will be used, together with any additional funds of the City which might be required for (i) a current refunding of all or a portion of the February 1, 2018 through 2028 maturities, aggregating up to \$555,000 in principal amount, of the City's General Obligation Improvement Bonds, Series 2007A, dated September 1, 2007 as date of original issue, and (ii) to pay the costs associated with issuing the Bonds.
- 2. The City Council desires to proceed with the sale of the Bonds by direct negotiation with Northland Securities, Inc. ("NSI"). NSI will purchase the Bonds in an arm's-length commercial transaction with the City.
- 3. The Mayor and the City Administrator are hereby authorized to approve the sale of the Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$600,000 and to execute a bond purchase agreement for the purchase of the Bonds with NSI, provided the total net savings is at least \$40,000.
- 4. Upon approval of the sale of the Bonds by the Mayor and the City Administrator, the City Council will take action at its next regularly scheduled or special meeting thereafter to adopt the necessary approving resolutions as prepared by the City's bond counsel.
- 5. NSI is authorized to prepare an Official Statement related to the sale of the Bonds.
- 6. If the Mayor and City Administrator have not approved the sale of the bonds to NSI and executed the related bond purchase agreement by December 31, 2016, this resolution shall expire.





Redevelopment of dilapidated residential sites into viable development sites as well as the removal of blighted and unsafe structures is essential to the vitality and economy of IRRRB service area. This program benefits the IRRRB service area by creating a cleaner, safer, healthier environment and encouraging new construction.

Eligible applicants:

Cities, townships, counties and tribal units of government. If a city or township has less than three residences for demolition, that city or township is encouraged to partner with neighboring communities to submit one application.

Eligible residential structures include:

- Single-unit residential homes
- Residential duplex homes
- Garages and accessory structures

Ineligible structures include:

- Decks or roofless structures
- Commercial buildings

Funding:

- The Residential Redevelopment program is funded at \$350,000 for FY 2016
- Maximum of \$3 per building square foot, or 75 percent of demolition costs including basements, whichever is less
- Homeowners and communities are responsible for all expenses not eligible or reimbursable

Application Process:

- Applications will be accepted beginning August 1 through August 14, 2015. All eligible
 applications received during this time period will be reviewed and grants may be awarded to the





LG215 Lease for Lawful Gambling Activity

Lease Term: The term of this agreement will be concurrent with the premises permit issued by the Gambling Control Board

Management: The owner of the pramises or the lessor will not manage the conduct of lawful gambling at the premises. The organization may not conduct any activity on behalf of the lessor on the lassed premises.

Participation as Players Prohibited: The lessor will not perdelpate directly or indirectly as a player in any lawful gambling conducted on the premises. The lesson's immediate family and any agents or gambling amployees of the lessor will not participate as players in the conduct of lawful gambling on the premises, except as authorized by Minnesote Statutes, Section 349.181.

Illegal Gambling: The lessor is award of the prohibition ageinst lilegal gambling in Minnesota Statutes 609,75, and the penalties for illegal gambling violations in Minnesote Rules 7865,0220, Subpart 3. In addition, the Board may authorize the organization to withhold rent for a parled of up to 90 days if the Board determines that illegal gambling occurred on the premises or that the leasor or its employees participated in the illegal gambling or knew of the gambling and did not take prompt action to stop the gambling. Continued banancy of the organization is authorized without payment of rent during the time period determined by the Board for violations of this provision, as authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Section 349.18, Subd. 1(e).

To the bast of the lessor's knowledge, the lessor effirms that any and all games or devices located on the premises are not being used, and are not capable of being used, in a manner that violates the prohibitions against lilegal gambling in Minnesota Statutos, Section 609,75.

Notwithstanding Minnesota Rules 7865.0220, Subpart 3, an organization must continue making rent payments under the terms of this lease, if the organization or its agents are found to be solely responsible for any lilegal gambling, conducted at this site, that is prohibited by Minnesota Rules 7861,0260, Subpart 1, Item H, or Minnesots Statutes, Section 609,75, unless the organization's agents responsible for the illegal gambling activity are also agents or employees of the lessor.

The lessor, the lessor's immediate family, any person residing in the same residence as the lessor, and env agents or employees of the lessor will not require the organization to perform any action that would violate statute or rule. The lessor must not modify or terminate this lease in whole or in part due to the lessor's violation of this provision. If there is a dispute as to whether a violation occurred, the lease will remain in affect pending a final determination by the Compliance Review Group (CRG) of the Board. The lessor agrees to arbitration when a violation of this provision is elleged. The arbitrator shall be the CRG.

Access to Permitted Premises: Consent is given to the Board and its agents, the commissioners of revenue and public safety and their agents, and law enforcement personnel to enter and inspect the permitted premises at any reasonable time during the business hours of the lessor. The organization has access to the premises during any time reasonable and when necessary for the conduct of lawful gambling.

Lessor Records: The lessor must maintain a record of all money received from the organization, and make the record avellable to the Sourd and its agents, and the commissioners of revenue and public safety and their agents upon demand. The record must be mointelned for 3-1/2 years,

Rent All-Inclusive: Amounts paid as rent by the organization to the lessor are all-inclusive. No other services or expenses provided or contracted by the lessor may be paid by the organization, including but not limited to:

- trash removal
- electricity, heat
- anow removal
- fanitorial and cleaning services
- other utilities or services
- lawn services
- security, security monitoring
- cost of any communication network or service required to conduct electronic pull-tabs games or electronic bingo
- in the case of bar operations, cash shortages. Any other expenditures made by an organization that is related to a lessed pramises must be approved by the director of the Board. Rent payments may not be made to an individual.
